Bagley_recharge: Recharge program participant, Greg Bagley, places a tarp in a canal to spread water out on his acreage in the early spring.

Dewey contract: Participants join the aquifer recharge program through a voluntary agreement.

Dewey springs_before: (Before) Rancher James Dewey indicates where recharge will enhance his groundwater fed springs later in the summer.

Dewey spring_after: (After) Rancher James Dewey surveys his springs in the late summer, enhanced through aquifer recharge activities during spring run-off.

Hansen_recharge: Teton Valley dairy farmer Ron Hansen spreads water out into a field early in the irrigation season to infiltrate soils and the aquifer.

Incidental recharge: To the untrained eye, recharge areas may appear as flooded, but are intentionally chosen to increase groundwater levels strategically in the Teton Basin.

Recharge monitoring: Irrigators work with Aquifer Recharge Program staff monitoring the impacts of water management.
